



Paul Reeves: This is not just burning the hell out of a piece of Redwood - it is the Japanese technique of Shou Sugi Ban or Yakisugi . Normally used for cedar cladding. I'm going to try it on a nice bit next without the resin lines and pockets. I could fill the voids with gold wax as a contrast. Why not join the Christchurch Society of Woodburners!
